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## Size

When determining size of your co-op consider cost per family, number of teachers needed, and size of your co-op space.

## Cost per family:

Divide your costs by number of families. If your cost for a year is $\$ 1000$, you will need ten families to keep costs to $\$ 100 /$ family.

Number of teachers:
If you are offering three periods a day and splitting kids into three groups (little, medium, big), you will need a bare minimum of nine teachers. If you want co-teachers, you will need eighteen.

Size of co-op space:
How many rooms do you have available? How many tables and chairs do you have available? How many tables and chairs can fit in a room?

Just like how organizations in the LDS church have a president with counselors, it is best if one person doesn't try to do everything. Having a director and a board helps prevent burnout, gets many involved, and brings in a lot of different ideas.
